For the first week of school, prepare a little something to share with your classmates. You will be giving a 5-minute presentation to small groups to share just one of your books.

Be creative! Here are some options:

Review the book for readers.

Create a poster or collage for your book.

Record a commercial or advertise the book.

Write some journal entries relating the book to your own life.

Perform a skit or recite the most dramatic part of your book with costumes or even helpers.

Build a model that depicts something in the book.

Create a board game, puzzles, codes, maps, etc.

Make a puppet to represent some aspect of your book.

Other ideas?

Discuss your ideas for the project with a parent. Let your parent(s) guide you to a really exciting and interesting presentation. If you create another way to present your book not listed above, by all means surprise and delight us! Just be ready to present your book during the first week of school to a small group of your classmates. It is sometimes easier to keep this lowtech; presentations using tech can be more difficult (but not impossible) to present in this format.

Please avoid reading the following theme books so they are new and exciting when we start these units: *Finding Langston*, *Where the Mountain Meets the Moon*, *A Long Walk to Water*, and *Fergus Crane*.
