Greetings CCLCS Families,




Postural Screening done during health class.

Protect Our School & Valuable Public School Options

Tell elected officials not to hurt charter public schools!



What's going on?

Elected officials have filed bills that, if adopted, would dramatically reduce funding for charter public schools, like ours. These bills would mean fewer kids could attend charter public schools in Massachusetts. Funding would be cut so much that some schools would even be forced to close.

Will these bills become law? Can we stop them?

We can absolutely stop these bills! Bills must go through many steps before becoming a law, and many are stopped along the way. The first step is a vote that is happening soon. So, we need your help writing to elected officials and calling their offices to let them know that our school, and all charter public schools, offer important and valuable options for families that should not be cut.



You know your child best, and you deserve the right to decide which public school is the right school for them.

How would these bills hurt our school?

If these bills became law, CCLCS could lose **over** 25% of our funding, and nearly 100 kids would no longer be able to attend our school.

But we can make sure that doesn't happen!
