### **Executive Director Search Committee COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDER SURVEY STATEMENT**

After our extraordinary Executive Director, Paul Niles, announced his retirement effective in June 2022, the Cape Cod Lighthouse Charter School Board of Trustees appointed an Executive Director Search Committee to conduct the search for a successor.

The Board has established a timeline and action plan for the search process that includes posting and advertising the position; reviewing the credentials of applicants; selecting semifinalists to interview; and proposing finalists to the full Board. The process will culminate with the appointment of a new Executive Director with a contract beginning in July 2022.

As part of the process, parents and community members will be able to meet and pose questions to the candidates and provide feedback to the search committee.

The Search Committee requests your participation in a [Community Stakeholder Survey](#) to help identify the desired qualifications and characteristics of the new Executive Director and school values, needs, and priorities. Your responses will help the Search Committee select candidates to interview and develop interview questions.

**6th Social Studies** - The World Heritage project was assigned today in class and is due Thursday, December 2. We will be working on the research and organization of our writing this week in school. Then, students will type up their paragraphs and create the model at home.
