Baa-Baa Black Sheep**Ms. GP**

In this seminar, students will join Mr. Gray (Pippi's dad) to see a sheep being sheared. We'll have the wool to play with! Students will learn to clean yarn, card yarn, spin and felt wool! If knitting, crocheting, textile arts are your thing, join us!!

Come be a part of the CCLCS garden! Be ready to get dirty and dig in the soil. We will learn about regenerative garden practices, which plants make the best companions, and how to plant for pollinators. We will tend to the crops, learn about composting, and care for the CCLCS gardens.

Chess: 64 Square Symphony**Mr. Novak**

Play chess, and more -- discuss the long and storied history of chess, including its famous personalities, from the "raised to be genius" Polgar sisters and other women of chess, to Fisher and Kasparov, to the current world champion Magnus Carlsen. We will discuss the role of computers in chess, and how computers have managed to become formidable challengers through algorithmic approaches to piece value and positional value. Students will learn how to use a chess clock, read and record algebraic notation and standard notation, and enjoy chess variants, like the fast-paced multiplayer version of chess called Bughouse. The goal of the Seminar is to provide hands-on experiences of painting in the real, as well as to develop an active artist portfolio history by showing artwork in multiple locations. Robotics**Mr. Merrill**

In this seminar, students will explore the fundamentals of robotics, including design, mechanics, and programming. Through hands-on projects, students will learn how to build and program robots to perform specific tasks, incorporating sensors, motors, and coding logic. Students will work collaboratively to solve engineering challenges, applying concepts such as movement, control systems, and automation. Topics include basic circuitry, mechanical systems, and block-based or text-based programming (e.g., Scratch, Python, or a robotics-specific language). The course will culminate in a final project where students design, build, and program a robot to complete a real-world-inspired challenge. This seminar emphasizes creativity, problem-solving, and the practical application of STEM concepts. No prior experience in robotics or programming is required.

Spring Birding**Mr. Crowell**

Discover the world of birds by learning to identify local species and explore their behaviors and habitats. This year, the seminar includes a collaboration with the Cape Cod Museum of Natural History's bird banding program for a hands-on look at bird research in action.
